Turner win sets up 3-way race

Pendleton County Judge-executive Henry Bertram this fall will face opposition for the first time in a general election. Bertram, a Democrat, will seek a third term against Phillip Turner, a Republican who defeated Jack Scroggins 234-165 in initial results from Tuesday's primary. Donald Wells, an independent, also will seek the county's highest seat in November.

Both parties held primaries to decide who will run for jailer. According to unofficial results, Timothy Saylor (212 votes) defeated Kimberly Green (157 votes) on the Republican ticket. He will face Ken Kells (833 votes), who won a four-way race among Democrats. His closest competitor was Joy Walsh (345 votes).

One incumbent lost his post as Alan Whaley beat Jack Sumpter for the Democratic magistrate, first district, spot.

In two Democratic constable races, Aaron Bonar (188 votes) beat Scott Shepperd (127 votes) in district one and Otto Stapleton Jr. (198 votes) defeated Tony McCarter (141 votes).

Jay Delaney, (1,312 votes) beat out Bradley Vaughn (502 votes) and Sue Carrol Lake (191 votes) to win the nonpartisan race for district judge-18th district, according to unofficial results.
