FLORENCE - The Northern Kentucky Police Chiefs Association honored several officers during its annual banquet in Edgewood last month. But it also recognized one citizen for his efforts in supporting police.

Greg "Shakey" Shaw, owner of Shakey's Pub and Grub in Florence, received the 2005 Chief Robert A. Shields Memorial Award for Outstanding Acts by a Citizen.

"Shakey does not hesitate to step up to help and would never expect recognition for his efforts," said Florence Police Chief Tom Szurlinski. "He operates his business in a manner that would make any city or county happy to have it located there. He is not only a business owner but a friend to many in the community, officers and private citizens alike."

Shaw said Szurlinski asked him to attend the event.

"They told me I probably wouldn't win but I was nominated," he said. "They already knew I won, so they kind of tricked me."

Shaw has hosted several fundraisers, including the Fraternal Order of Police's annual golf outing. Such fundraisers help the FOP's charitable causes such as Shop-With-A-Cop, United

Ministries and Bean Bash. Shaw also hosted the Florence Citizen's Academy reunion. After learning that the children of a Florence officer had diabetes, he hosted a fundraiser for the Juvenile Diabetes Association.

Shaw said he supports the police because of the rapport he has built with them over the years.

"It's just always been that way," he said. "They come into my place a lot, and we've become friends. They help me, and I help them."

In January, Shaw was also honored with the Albert Hue Award by the city of Florence for his civic work and help with local charities.

"I guess they thought I was dying," Shaw, 54, joked about the city award. "I had pneumonia, and I think they thought they had to honor me before old Shakey died. It was funny."
