Coming home to Thomas More

All alumni can expect a welcome

CRESTVIEW HILLS - Alumni from Thomas More College's 85 years will descend on the school's Crestview Hills campus today for its annual homecoming.

For Class of '52 alum Tom Ginney, homecoming is a chance to socialize.

"It's a good chance to see old friends, swap war stories and see who can lie to each other the most," joked Ginney, who retired as the national accounts manager for Dole Foods. He'll be attending with his wife and Class of '54 graduate, the former Joyce Martin.

"Thomas More's homecoming festivities are an opportunity for our alumni to return to campus and reconnect with former classmates, as well as faculty and coaches," said Kelly Marsh, the school's director of communication.

This year's baseball team will honor players from the '40s and '50s. Afterward, former baseball players will hit the field again to play in either the alumni baseball or softball game.

After the games, a picnic will be held until the football team kicks off at 1:30 against Presidents' Athletic Conference rival Thiel College, in Greenville, Pa. Thomas More's record is 2-0 this year.

For the Ginneys, football at Thomas More is a relatively new event. The first team was formed in 1990, and a permanent home was built in 1999. Thomas More had three undefeated seasons in 1991, 1995 and 2001.

In 2005, it joined the Presidents' Athletic Conference.
